THE DROUGHT.

Notwithstanding that it has rained most copiously both north and south, the accounts we hear from all parts of the country are of the most melancholy character.

Sheep farmers completely will receive the truth of our remarks; the system of crowding posts upon pasture-land has been so much exploded that landowners in what is called the good years have made splendid fortunes, now covered with dead animals and the scenes of ruin and desolation.

Take any one of the favorite parties within the district named, and we wish to show a square inch upon which some one's sheep have not trodden in the same field which formerly led to three millions of sheep at the very utmost, is now made to support Twenty Millions.

Laten down for the very roots, the young grass which for the last few years has germinated from seed which through some cause or other has lain dormant in the earth, we have at last arrived at the climax; all the seed has sprouted, all the grass is eaten up, and now there is nothing left. Glossy as this picture may appear, there are few who can deny our accuracy.

The best crop in the country, and that which is the most troublesome is the thistle. A year in which the thistle crop by one-fifth is a severity of winter felt.

This year, owing to the extreme coldness of the winter, followed by cutting frost in the spring, the thistle seed did not grow, but we all know and it has been proved that this seed will sometimes remain for years in the ground without shooting forth.

The clover or carucilla seed is becoming less and less each year, owing to its inaccessibility to the stock. Thousands of pounds of this most essential of seeds are taken from the land; the granular is becoming daily scarcer and scarcer, as it is a grass which has rarely failed to yield, it being the seed of all grasses, and thus it is that the clover and granular are now becoming exhausted.

Was there ever a greater d. in this? No doubt last winter was unusually dry, but we do not think that this summer has been quite the contrary, and if reference is only had to Mr. Stoddard and Diavet weather book for last year and two years before, it will be found that it has rained more during the months of November and December 1863 than for many previous years.

There are no more prairie than the parties Logan, Merrells, Jones, Morgan, Gaudin, and St. V. etc., which are completely eaten down and exhausted for the next twelve months, no matter how much it rains, they will be perfectly unfit to sleep or cattle.

Many persons profess surprise that Pinar, which has hitherto been a goodly land, but which has in the present year it is simply because since 1850 nearly all the stock has been off it, and now the land is a natural consequence are covered with the best of grasses.

Every sheep farmer in the country to prosper and be prepared for drought, he should have three distinct runs for his sheep, upon which either sheep or cattle should feed.

Not all the rain from Heaven will suffice to resist the dry winds unless the sheep are taken off them, and the grasses allowed to rest two or may manage to get along for another year or so, but this is a very uncertain calculation.

Foreigners. To the farmer with your sheep, and your water in abundance. This industry is not so ancient as to be so much degraded as supposed, for it is more dangerous to it for you to remain at home to witness your sheep each day, dropping from sheer starvation, and you and your families left homeless in this distant country.

LATEST FROM ENGLAND.

Patent Bill. On the 11th of November, through the kindness of an English merchant we have been favored with American papers up to the 10th Nov. arrived per sailing vessel yesterday morning.

Political organizations, with a view to overthrow the present military rule, are now in the air. Five thousand letters are intended for shipment to Europe, partly belonging to rebels, had been seized by the collector of Internal Revenue, but nearly four thousand copies were obtained by loyal persons they were given up, and the remainder stored for the present.

Consequence of the severity of breadstuffs and provisions in New Orleans was arriving there in considerable quantities. From want of labor and fuel, the sugar crop is very small.

From the move on the Rappahannock the Federals are expecting important results, even should it have no greater effect in view than the destruction of the opposing rebel force for the defence of Richmond—if such should be effected, Richmond and the State of Virginia will soon be rendered untenable to the rebels, with or without a general battle between Lee and Grant.

Secretary Seward, in a recent speech, compares the rebel force at 200,000 men. In consequence of the defeat of the Democrats in Ohio and Pennsylvania, it is supposed that the last ray of hope for the South has been extinguished.

The rebels have at a recent date on the New River, N.C., ready for a raid. The war debt of North Carolina is being rapidly extinguished by the proceeds received from her blockade runners, which are making regular trips into Wilmington.

It is reported that Jeff. Davis is about to send commissioners to notorious 'black-slaves' in Arkansas to bid them to join in a rebellion against the Union.

Intelligence has been received at Washington from Charleston, Va. that General Averell and Dix had succeeded in driving the rebels under Mandell Welles for several miles down the valley east of Greencastle.

1st. The Bank receives at interest any sum from Twenty five dollars currency up to one dollar upwards.
2nd. The interest allowed is six per cent (6 p) per annum which is liquidated every six months.
3rd. The depositor can at any time return the whole or part of the money deposited.
4th. Once the amount deposited reaches Twenty five thousand dollars currency a dividend of dollars after the depositor if he wishes can on an account current be drawn to the sum established by the Bank.
5th. In case the depositor loses his Pass Book it can be replaced by another on paying twelve dollars currency, and advertising the loss in the public newspapers.
