INDIA AND CHINA. The India and China mail has arrived, but the news brought is not of an interesting character. From India we learn that the 1st Highlanders had been engaged in a conflict upon the frontier in which 60 men were killed or wounded, including three officers killed and two wounded.

Broga, arrived in a great hurry sword drawn and renewed the task, the other was kept from performing, varying it by piercing him in the side, till the pain forced Connell to let go his grasp, and immediately Diaz set to work again, striking him on the head, the face, and the neck several times with the flat of his sword. Not content, he aimed at Connell's head with the edge, which took effect right over the eye; he fell to the ground bled in blood. Diaz thought this not enough; he seized his victim again and thought to take him to prison, but as more than thirty were witnessing the deed, and of these four were relations, they prevented him from doing this, and helped the wounded man into Mr. Swengel's house, who sent for the four doctors of the villa, and the juice do put at that time Sr. M. de Caldeira. While dressing Connell's wounds, Diaz again entered, accompanied by two soldiers, to take his victim with him.
