THE HOENSA.

The Managing Committee of the Hoenza has passed to the society the yearly report of their proceedings.

The report is very favourable, and shows the prosperous state of the establishment, as a proof of which we publish the following:

The Hoenza during 1863 had—Receipts ... \$377,560 0 Expenses ... 176,818 0 Balance in favour of the Hoenza ... \$200,742 0

The receipt fund stands thus: Deposited in the Bank, Jan. 7, 1864 ... \$31,676 0 Interest for 1863 capitalised ... 2,465 0 10 p. c. of the Building Fund ... 5,211 0

The shareholders will thus see that there is a dividend of 10 p. c. upon the surplus of \$914 5.

The difference between this dividend and that of 1862 does not necessarily indicate a falling-off in the establishment, though the committee, from various circumstances was enabled to publish a larger dividend in 1862 from smaller receipts than in 1863.

In the first place the Building Fund had in hand in January, 1862, the sum of \$41,673 5, which represented 3 1/2 p. c. besides, the monthly amounts to be recovered at that date, and which had not been set aside to the fund in liquidation of 1861, amounting to \$38,550, from which were to be deducted pending debt against the fund, \$28,300, leaving a surplus of \$11,929, which re-presented at that time 0.65 p. c. Join to these amounts the interest due upon them for the year, it will be seen that the former committee had, besides the regular receipts, an additional 1 p. c. which on added it, with smaller receipts, to give a higher dividend than in 1863.

The managing committee has also the pleasure of announcing that the receipts of the year just ended show an increase of \$10,855 over those of 1862, and that the 10 p. c. allocated to the fund exceeds the 10 p. c. of 1862 by \$35,507.

The Committee has also to observe that the interest incurred in requiring the building, and thereby increasing its value, must be looked upon as so much more capital invested, such as the mortgage support of the large hall, the marble supports and cornices on the outside, the lunel of the aljibe, &c. The present committee has paid \$15,975 for glass for repairing the roof, ordered by the former committee.
