INAUGURATION PHOTOGRAPH.

We have seen the four views taken by Sig. Bartoli, the eminent photographer, on occasion of the late celebration. The camera was erected on the roof of the Conventualia, which commands a splendid bird's-eye panorama of the site of the Inauguration, and the route of the intended lake.

Part I. shows the spot where the first sod was turned, and although from the great distance the figures are small we have an excellent idea of the most imposing scene in the day's performance.

Part II. gives the tent where the banquet was held, with the British and Italian hospitals in the background, and far out the roadstead of B. Ayres and its shipping. As a rail contract to the joyful celebration, the views of the Lunatic Asylum ranged along the railing in front, probably unobscured of the great event of the day.

Part III. is a lively picture of the 400 navvies at work, for while the force of reason and the flow of soul spread animation along the banquet tables, the general view of the men cheering. The views of the Boas and Barracks in the background are enchanting.

Part IV. shows a more distant view, embracing a part of the British and Italian cutting, where a small band of workmen ply their instruments. This would form a pretty landscape, the surface being broken and wooded all around. In the distance may be seen the quays of Lomas de Zamora, which will not soon be placed within a few minutes of the capital.

Three of our readers who may have half-an-hour at leisure, should visit Signor Bartoli's studio, Recoleta Nueva, Plaza Victoria, where, besides the above pictures, is a splendid camera, representing the most perfect likeness at life size. The views of the Inauguration are taken on card-board 8 inches square, and by means of a powerful magnifying glass, the feature of the panorama starts forth before the eye. They will be forwarded, we believe, by this packet, to the "London News."
