In that document they state one of their countrymen, M. Beney, a milkman, Rosario Oriental, had been brutally treated on the 24th ult. by order of the Minister of War, Perez.

If those fellows only displayed one-half the zeal in catching thieves that they do in annoying innocent people, they might be worth their salt. As it is, they are of no use, and they are by no means in means handsome. The despatch they display on Sunday morning in allowing a crowd to rush into the Plaza, and thus permit the thieves to escape more easily, was a gem of strategy and generalship.

Por Folia de España.—Our friend the 'Fueho' has so used up all his energies in writing a milk and North-Sea Railway, that with the above heading, he coolly tells its readers that it is obliged to leave out much original matter, but at the same time inserts a paragraph on the Central Railway which appeared in the Standard a fortnight ago, and has had sufficient time to go up to Rosario, be published there, and come back here. The next time, if it is short of space, it will find a short article in the London Times of February last, on a fire in the church of the Compañia de Santiago, Chile, and a full account of the benevolent exertions of the people of the Argentine in favor of the sufferers. 2nd. The interest allowed is *six per cent [6%]* per annum which is liquidated every six months.
3rd. The depositor can at any time retire the whole or part of the money deposited.
4th. Once the amount deposited exceeds *Twenty five thousand dollars currency or one thousand dollars silver* the depositor if he wishes can open an account *interest* according to the rates established by the Bank.
5th. In case the depositor loses his Pass Book it can be replaced by another on paying *three dollars currency*, and advertising the loss in the public newspapers.

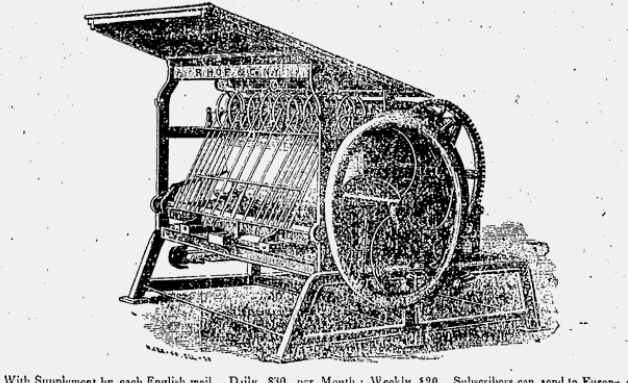
