Navigation of the Amazon. Monday, Feb. 8th, Sir R. Marchison in the chair.

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Another Capture.—The police are fairly out policing themselves: last Sunday they actually captured one whole live robber, a fellow who lives in town, but who of late has been drawing a revenue from the road near Flores.

Drowned.—On Tuesday morning a Frenchman who took his horse into the river near the Customhouse, to bathe him, slipped off and was drowned.

Disusted.—On Monday night, during a squall, the national schooner Sirena, anchored in the inner roads, lost her bowsprit and both her masts.

Opera.—The 'Pueblo' says that on Friday or Saturday next the Barber of Seville will be given by the Italian Opera Company. If the night be fine we may expect a full house, as this opera is a great favorite with the French and English. And as another inducement, should such be required, Mme. Mollo will take the part of Rosina.

Strangers, if true.—One of our native colleagues states that, a few evenings ago, whilst a sereno was conducting some young gentlemen to the Hotel Cañon, one of them said, "Now, Master Sereno, you'll see how I'll make you let me go," and stabbing him, ran off; only to be captured again by some other serenito. The wounded man was taken to no seriously injured, and was taken to the hotel.

Maritime.—In the 'Reforma Pacifica' of Montevideo, we read that the Austrian brig Lanna, from Liverpool, with a cargo of coal, had taken fire, and it was expected that she would be totally destroyed. Spontaneous combustion of the cargo is supposed to be the cause of the accident.

From the North of the Rio Negro.—Erique Castro, with his squadron, was proceeding towards Palmar to join Flores. On the 4th inst. there was not one of Flores' men left in Fray Bentos, and it was then supposed that Flores was near the Rio Negro. The general report is, that this vagabond has given strict orders to make no prisoners, thus reducing the war to a struggle without quarter. The Brazilians from the frontiers, who have joined Flores, are distinguished for their ferocity. Murders are still rife. A Government officer, who was prisoner cut in Fray Bentos, had his throat by the escort which was conducting him to Flores.—'Reforma Pacifica.'

San Jose.—Persons lately from there, state that upwards of 70 individuals, who belonged to the Coquiabo squadron and to the Laguna del Durazno, have delivered themselves up to the authorities. They all declare, that unless Flores fight soon, his hold will all desert, as they have no idea of wintering a second time in the camp.—(R.P.)

Colonia.—The steamer Treinta y tres has returned from Colonia, where she left part of her crew and the officers of the dismantled steamer, Villa del Salto. All the department remains quiet, and there are no signs of Flores' party in the neighbourhood. In Mercedes every preparation was made against an expected attack of Flores to the South of Rio Negro, but up to the 6th there had been no attempt made. On the contrary, the demoralisation of the rebel troops, ever since the arrival of Suarez with his beaten troops, has so much increased, that it is very probable that Flores will have to abandon his idea.—(R.P.)

Transandin Railway.—A Señor Bois has presented to the Chile Government a proposal to make a railway across the Andes, connecting Chile with the Argentine Provinces. According to his statement, the most arduous part of the undertaking would be on the other side—in fact, all the engineering difficulties would be there, for once on this side, the ground is as flat as a billiard table. There seem to be no great obstacles in the way of this project, when such a man as Henry Meiggs is at the head of it.

Dr. Agüero.—The venerable rector of the National College, died on Tuesday evening, and his remains were deposited in the Cathedral vaults last night.

Northern Railway.—In consequence of the universal complaints against this line, for irregularity of service, Mr. Zimmerman, we read, has despatched an engineer by French mail, to hurry the transmission of some new locomotives from England.

Military Mutiny.—The mutiny of the 9th bat. at Jujuy, as very alarming. The soldiers, after sacking Col. Wilde's magazine, left the town en route for Salta. They were pursued by 170 National Guards, and after a bloody affray, which lasted more than an hour, 40 of the rebels were captured, 2 killed, and 5 wounded. The rest struck out for the hills.

Robbers let Loose.—The 'Pueblo' mentions three notorious ruffians who are daily seen walking through our streets.—Sesferino and Jose Grouso, and Pablo Yereta. We will give the interesting biography tomorrow.

ON 'CHANGE.

April 13, 1864. The Pol-a was very dull to-day, and nothing doing. Everybody was anxiously looking out for the news from Europe, which is likely to affect produce in a remarkable manner. Con-

siderable disappointment was felt at the delay of the Mersey, for although not due, she was expected to arrive to-day. Our despatches, per Uda, are considered unimportant, the Lisbon telegrams, per French mail, being later, and having no mention of the impending war in all Europe. Some people doubt the statement that M. Caumartin has presented himself at the Tribunal de Comercio; but we have reason to believe it most certain. There is nothing doing in the south plaza; indeed, it would be difficult for a man even on horseback to get through it, the mud is so intense. We believe the north market is much the same. Specie still looks up; it opened to-day same as yesterday, rising 10c. and closing at 29 30. There were sales for the end of the year at 29 15. The market was very firm, buyers being numerous, but sellers very scarce.

The San Juan shareholders are in good spirits, but those of the Gas Co. very indignant with the neglect of publishing accounts; the latter applaud our remarks and insist on an *éclaircissement*.

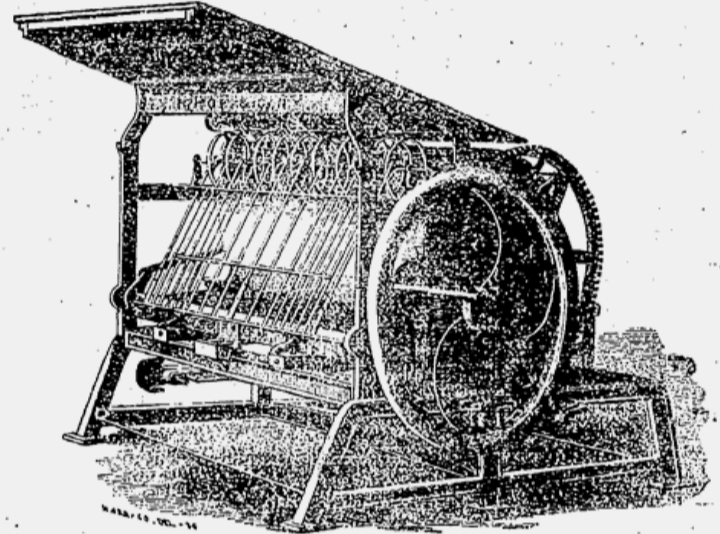
