The play of "Colonel Capstick," (Mr. Sill) on hearing that Mr. Dunder, the Clockmaker (Mr. Sanders) had taken the "objec" home for three or four days, and his joy on discovering that the same was not his wife, as he imagined, but portions of a favourite comedy, which had broken, were highly amusing and well performed; but Sally Smart (Mr. P. C. Smith) was the life of the piece, although Mr. W. C. Smith, as "Jermina," and Mr. Castle, as "Mrs. Capstick," and Mr. T. P. Smith, as "Christopher Capstick," assisted greatly to its success.

The female characters throughout were particularly well got up, and Messrs. W. and R. Castle, as such were really attractive and pretty; but with all the deception of powder, &c. we could not help observing that "Sally Smart" was compelled to sacrifice her whiskers for the occasion. The comic duet of Messrs. Payne and Holloway drew well-deserved applause; but we fear the "Dicks' Dance" called in the Spanish hand-bills, "La may gar ciosa encañonca comica," was not fully appreciated.

The inter-vals between the pieces were rather too long, although well filled up with both vocal and instrumental music by the officers, with the exception of the two boys before mentioned here and there. **LIVE PLANT TREES.**  
At the usual weekly meeting of the Manchester Cotton Supply Association on Tuesday, Feb. 14th, a letter was read from Corrientes, in the Argentine Republic, stating that great activity prevails in the cultivation of cotton, and that, should the season be propitious, not less than 300,000 lbs. will be produced in the province of Corrientes alone. The Government is rendering every facility, and proposing for establishing cotton plantations in a

large scale have been made, which, it is expected, will be cordially adopted. Various measures are in progress, which we likely to prove highly advantageous.

The Royal mail steamship *Onida*, Captain Davis, with the *Brazil*, Buenos Ayres, and Montevideo mails, arrived at Southampton on the afternoon of Friday, the 4th inst. She brought 40 passengers; specie from Montevideo, £2,075; from Buenos Ayres, £2,010; from Rio de Janeiro, £201; and three consignments of diamonds, value not stated. 
