Never before have the festivals of Independence been so brilliant, and attended with such crowds as this year. At that hour he invited his friends to go up in the balloon a few hundred yards by rope, and an American lady was among the volunteer ascendants.

Wednesday's Día de la Patria was celebrated with a salvo at sunrise, and at an early hour the national children sang the National hymn around the column of Plaza Victoria.

The distribution of premiums took place on Thursday, and it being the feast of Corpus Christi the churches were crowded. Mr. Wells could not make an ascent, as they told him the wind would blow him into the marshy islands of the Paraná whence he might never be able to extricate himself.

FIRST TRAIN TO V. LUXAN

Monday 23rd inst. being fixed for the opening of this new section for public traffic, I arrived at the Western terminus at 7 am, finding there would be a difficulty in obtaining a ticket in the concourse of excursionists. There were however only a few letter vendors and magrals of diligences, besides a group of rustic belles who looked to disadvantage in the keen, biting air of a winter's morning.

An omnibus conveys the passengers for 3 sols up, over a very uneven road and at a dangerous speed; the shop owners of Calle Real, standing at their doors as we pass, and we alight at the Plaza.

The sales of saladero produce during the fortnight have been close to 12,000 cowhides, 6000 bassides, and 400 pipes of tallow. The last price paid for salted hides 00lb., 30 1/2 rs. The stock is estimated at 8000 salted hides, 4000 maderos. In the silvers 8000 cowhides have been sold 22 lb. at 35 1/2 to 30 1/2 rs. on board. Salted horse hides—8000 have been sold at 15 1/2 rs. at 35 lb.

Tallow—455 pipes at 14 1/2 rs. In beefed beef there have been no sales, and the stock is large, 146,000 quintals.

A vessel arrived to-day with railway iron, from London for the three railways, Southern, Western and Boca. We hear that the Victoria has been chartered, but we have not heard the rate; she only arrived two days ago. This shows the great scarcity of vessels in port.

The Paraguayan steamer arrived to-day. We understand she has several boxes of cotton on board for transportation to Europe.

We have received another sample of Corrientes Cotton, but as yet the owner has not made his appearance.
