Outrage on two Englishmen.

We have been informed of a gross insult offered to two young English gentlemen, by the authorities of Banda Oriental. Messrs Payne and Solly arrived per last British packet.

No one that has at heart the interest of these countries can fail to regret the reputation of these disgraceful occurrences, the victims of which are generally new-comers.

STATE OF THE INTERIOR.

Nothing of great note has occurred in the provinces since the date of our last review, although that period has not been unmarked by events of considerable importance.

Amongst these we would mention the elections in Entre Rios, where the most powerful chief in the country has quietly retired from the Governorship.

We consider this circumstance as very important, as it is proof of the perfect good faith of General Urquiza, a man whose power and influence in the country are very great.

Mr. Urquiza, although an ardent promoter of the advancement of the material interests of his country is a man whose hands are more or less tied by the element of disorganization which have attached themselves to him as a great party chief.

The state of the provinces is satisfactory. The amount of goods despatched for the interior within the last month has been considerable, and the receipts of wool, hides, hair, manufactured goods, wines and fruit has been in proportion.

The news of the definite arrangement of the Cordoba Railroad, and the disposal of all the shares offered, has of course made a great impression here.

Although Cordoba cannot be said to enjoy the profound state of political tranquility that blesses the province of Santa Fe, nothing has occurred there of importance since our last review.

The country people are busy at their agricultural labors, and the commercial aspect of the province is improving. The news of the definite arrangement of the railroad was received there with great rejoicings.

The mines of San Juan are becoming richer every day. A very respectable amount of silver is now got out.

There is a good deal of excitement in Buenos Ayres in reference to the transatlantic railroad direct from that city to the Pass lately discovered by the great engineer Mr. Miggins; but after all, an examination of the map will show clearly that Mr. Wheelwright's scheme to carry a road through the upper provinces, across the Andes at the pass of San Francisco, and join it to the Co-

piapo road, already constructed, is much the most feasible of the two.

To return to the Littoral. The northern frontier of this province has been perfectly secured against all future depredations of the Indians.

The great military road starting from a point opposite Corrientes, and running in a direct line to Santiago del Estero, has been surveyed half way and the native tribes, through whose territory it passes have not only not molested the surveying party, but have offered them every assistance in their power.

In the capital of this province the office of Governor, unlike other provinces is going 'abeyance'. The finances are in a flourishing state, and all the different Departments administered with prudence and economy.

We are happy to inform our English readers that a new English Magazine is about to be established in Rosario, to be dedicated entirely to the advancement of the material prosperity of the Argentine Republic.

The "Argentine Citizen" is to be edited by a distinguished literary gentleman, who has already done good service with his experienced pen.

The Pavon arrived to-day with fifty passengers and some specie; everything in the interior is quiet, but Peru and Spain seem preparing for a fight.

We have received an important letter from T. Stollerfort and Sons, Liverpool, which we shall publish in our next.

The collections through town were rather better to-day than usual, the shopkeepers having apparently done well during the feast days.
