THE ROSARIO MAILS.

Revolution in Salta.

Escape of Prisoners in Cordoba.
The "Ferro-carri" (per Emeralda) contains important news. We have full particulars of the revolt in Salta. On the 8th ult., the National Guards and citizens turned out en masse and deposed the Governor, on the plea of preventing the Federal party from getting the upper hand, and as causing a civil war. Their choice fell on Don Jose Uruburu (late President of the National Chamber of Deputies at B. Ayres), but the Provincial Chambers refused to assemble and ratify the election, whereupon the head of the Legislature made a second coup d'etat, and in their name congratulated Sor. Uruburu, as if the Chambers were in session. The new Governor then issued a circular to the various Provincial Governments, announcing his accession on the grounds stated.

Dates from Cordoba are to the 3d inst. Ten prisoners escaped from the city jail, and have not been retaken. (See our article on Martin Garcia, to-day.) "The Indians are troublesome at Rio Cuatro, coming within a mile of the town, but Baigorria is unable to attack them, his regiment having lost over 100 by desertion. The "Reo" states that the murderer of Sor Centeno is living quietly at Rio Cuatro and the authorities will not seize him.

Governor Oroño has handed over the reins of power in Santa Fe to Sor Calen. The Committee of the Central Railway is busily collecting shares at Rosario.

ARGENTINE REPUBLIC.

State of the Frontiers, A. D. 1864

The following is an extract from a letter dated Rio Cuarto, May 17th: "I find things here in a most miserable state on account of the invasions of the Indians. All the extractions are completely abandoned, and in this place we live in hourly fear that the Indians will attempt an entrance. All repairs to the plaza at night are ceasing to stop in their houses. I am happy to say that thus far the stock of the estancia has suffered, it is only in a few 'yegues.' It is confidently expected that this moon an invasion will be made in this quarter.

I cannot at present say when I shall leave for Buenos Ayres, but I am determined to do so as soon as possible, or, as to remaining here under present circumstances, I will not, on any considerations."

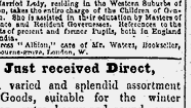
