IMPORTANT FROM MONTEVIDEO.

Her Britannic Majesty's steam gun vessel 'Spider,' Commander Stubbs, arrived here yesterday from Montevideo, with very important despatches for His Excellency, the President of the Argentine Republic, and H. B. M.'s Minister Plenipotentiary.

The British steamer 'Paraguay' arrived on Friday the 17th inst., 42 days from England. During the voyage her cargo shifted, which caused her to heel over very much on her left side in which state she arrived at Montevideo.

The Brazilian Squadron had arrived at Montevideo, and a French sloop of war from France, the 'Fortuna,' and gun boat 'Decide,' form the French squadron there.

Her Britannic Majesty's ships at Montevideo were, H. M.'s gunboat 'Shieldrake,' Acting senior officer during the absence of the 'Satellite,' Capt. S. S. Crofton, the 'Trition,' Lieut. and Commander Napier, which vessel returns to convey the Foreign Embassy on their return to Buenos Ayres. The 'Spider,' Lieut. and Commander Stubbs, left under sail about 4 o'clock, and experienced thick foggy weather the whole voyage up from Montevideo.

The Esmeralda arrived at San Fernando on Saturday evening with mails from Corrientes, which arrived here by mail some night, the steamer coming into port on Sunday with 21 passengers.

The Salto arrived yesterday at 2 p.m. from the River Uruguay with 57 passengers, and peaceful rumours.

The British gunboat arrived yesterday morning from Montevideo, with important news.

Yet the 'Nacional' says 'no steamer arrived today.' They may have been asleep all day at 41 Bolivar.
