FOREIGN AMATEUR RACING SOCIETY

During the last few days an advertisement appeared in our columns, to the effect that it was proposed to revive the old English racing club, and that all friends were invited to attend on Tuesday evening at the Casa del Progreso.

At 8 o'clock there were 20 gentlemen assembled, among whom we were glad to note some of our oldest sportsmen and several Irish estancieros who came to enrol themselves in the turfing fraternity.

In 1859 there was 45,341 bales exported from Buenos Ayres. In 1862 there were over 63,000 bales exported, giving almost in round numbers 180 millions of arrobas.

But let us pause, rather pertinently, what will become of the paper money if the sheepfarmers next shearing refuse to sell their wool, except in specie? If the wealth of the country had not increased in such a gigantic manner since the fall of Rosa, the paper money which belongs to his history would now be forgotten.
